The European Cyber Women Day Awards: a major cyber highlight!

For 3 years now, the European Cyber Women Day Awards have been a major event highlighting not only cyber issues, which are more relevant than ever, but also the incredible journey of inspiring women who show us that cybersecurity isn't just a man's job!

Its goal is to reach gender equality in cybersecurity by drawing more women to these exciting and useful jobs, which are increasingly involved in economics and current events. This cannot be achieved without women and men in the field committing to and furthering this goal.

Thus, on the initiative of Founder and President Nacira Salvan, the CEFCYS (Circle of Women in Cybersecurity) will organise the 3rd European Cyber Women Day Awards once again, to reward 16 women in the industry all over France and Europe for their work and their societal involvement, in a world where cyberattacks are increasing.

The Awards are open to all women in France and Europe who work in the field of cybersecurity. A European woman and a French woman will be awarded in each of the 7 following categories:

- Woman Leader or CEO in Cybersecurity
- Woman Professional in Cybersecurity Governance (RSSI, CISO, DPO, Audit, etc.),
 Expertise (Pentester, Analyst, Architect, Crypto), Teacher, etc.
- Woman in Cybersecurity Support Sales Representative, Marketing, HR, Acquisitions, etc.
- Woman Student in Cybersecurity
- Woman Cyber Hope
- Woman Researcher in Cybersecurity

Finally, 2 original awards will also be added to this year's edition:

- Jury's Favorite Prize
- CEFCYS's Favorite Prize "NUNO FILIPE Award"

The prizes will be awarded on the evening of Thursday 20 October at Campus Cyber (Puteaux), after a rewarding day dedicated to talks regarding the future of cybersecurity, women working in cybersecurity, and "the forgotten" of the digital sector.

A 2022 edition more relevant than ever

Cybersecurity and the place of women in the workforce are currently among the many hotbutton issues for companies.

In these post-pandemic times of economic, social and global uncertainty, cyber-related issues are on everyone's minds. The conflict in Ukraine, and more recently and closer to us geographically, the cyberattack on the Corbeil Essonnes hospital, have shown how critical this threat is and how quickly we need to train and take concrete action to address that issue.

With the Covid-19 pandemic, companies also became increasingly aware of that problem as they had to install or reinforce security in their IT systems — for many of them out of necessity — (for clients and for their own employees). But the broader society was no exception to the rule. Employees had to learn to work differently by going fully remote, and people started to understand the havoc that cyber pirates could wreak on their personal lives or their companies.

However, although cyber-related issues are getting more significant and visible in our society, and our leaders have taken full notice of this, cyberattacks are soaring and will remain a threat for the foreseeable future...

Our society is shifting: the topic of corporate diversity and gender equality – specifically the place of Gen Z, seniors and women in the workplace – is at the heart of every discussion. Though gender equality is making progress in France, it is not a reality yet. Today, only 4 women are at the head of CAC 40 companies (February 2022), i.e. the companies with the most significant stocks in France. However, it would take over 200 women getting executive positions within CAC 40 companies to reach even a 40% representation quota. So, there is still a long way to go. Without going so high up in the hierarchy, according to the 2020 DESI report, only 18% of ICT specialists in Europe are women, and in 2021, only 10,6% of employees working in cybersecurity in France were women (source: ANSSI, 2021). On the other hand, according to a report by Talents du Numérique (March 2022), the need for qualified and specialised professionals is such that over 500,000 jobs are available in France in this field, for all kinds of diplomas and all levels of expertise including junior positions. The French National Agency for the Security of Information Systems (ANSSI) estimates that today, only 25% of recruitment needs are fulfilled.

How can we simultaneously address these two modern issues that are cybersecurity and women's place in society? That's where the European Cyber Women Day Awards come in!
